4-year universities

Earn a bachelor's degree through a four-year program. These longer programs require you to choose an area of focus for your studies. The campuses are more selective, have larger campus sizes, and offer more activities outside of class. A bachelor's degree can be required for some professional careers or advanced studies.

2-year campuses

Earn an associate degree through a two-year program. These shorter programs give you a good, general education. The campuses feature lower costs, smaller campus sizes, and often let you transfer the credits you earn to a four-year university.
