The Wisconsin Guarantee

As of Fall 2025, first-year applicants who submit an application and all supporting materials by the Early Action deadlines and who meet minimum course requirements, as defined by the Board of Regents, will be automatically eligible for admission via the Wisconsin Guarantee at UW-Madison if they meet any of the following:

(1) They are enrolled in a public, private, or tribal high school in Wisconsin and are ranked in the top 5% of their class at the end of their junior year (11th grade) and their class has more than 15 students.

(2) They are a Wisconsin resident who is homeschooled or enrolled in a virtual private school and achieved an ACT examination score that places them in the national 98th percentile ranking or higher.

(3) They are a Wisconsin resident and a National Merit Scholarship finalist.

Scholarships & Financial Aid

Applicants should not wait until they have been admitted to apply for scholarships. Once applicants have submitted their application to UW-Madison, they must activate their NetID and password to be eligible for select automatically-awarded scholarships.

The Wisconsin Scholarship Hub is a one-stop shop where students create a profile to review, determine eligibility, and apply for scholarships. Students should check the Hub each year as more scholarships become available as students continue in their program: go.wisc.edu/mywish. Scholarships deadlines vary, but most will have a deadline of February 1. In addition, to our scholarships, we recommend pursuing additional funding opportunities through your students' work, community, and organizations.

The December 1 FAFSA priority filing deadline is back. Students who are eligible for federal financial aid are strongly encouraged to complete their FAFSA as soon as possible for the most possible aid. If there are any changes to the October 1 FAFSA opening date, we will communicate that with you, your students, and their supporters.

We are thrilled to share that Bucky's tuition promise has expanded the income threshold, guaranteeing a period of free tuition and segregated fees for incoming Wisconsin first-year and transfer students in an on-campus program whose family's household adjusted gross income is \$65,000 or less.

Wisconsin Tribal Educational Promise

The Wisconsin Tribal Educational Promise Program provides additional financial support to fund the difference between any previous financial aid received and the full in-state cost of attendance for Native Nations students attending an undergraduate on-campus UW-Madison degree program.

To be eligible, students must qualify as a Wisconsin resident for tuition purposes, be pursuing their first undergraduate degree, and be verified as an enrolled member of any one of the eleven federally recognized American Indian Tribes in Wisconsin to be eligible for the Wisconsin Tribal Educational Promise.

The program will provide eight consecutive semesters (four years) of support for Native Nations students who enter as incoming first-year students and continue to make satisfactory progress, or four consecutive semesters (two years) of support for Native Nations students who enter UW-Madison as new transfer students.

Current students will receive their semesters of eligibility based on their term of admission.

Minimum Coursework Requirements

An applicant's high school record should demonstrate both rigor and breadth in the types of coursework they pursue. Applicants **must** meet the minimum course requirements listed below to be eligible for admission to UW–Madison. Competitive applicants often take additional credits in the core subject areas, including the most challenging advanced-level work offered at or through their school in as many areas as possible, while maintaining a strong GPA.

*** Math requirement includes at least one year each of algebra, geometry, and advanced math with algebra or geometry prerequisites.
**** While there is no requirement for world language to be admitted to the university, taking two years of the same world language in high school is
highly recommended, as this can fulfill the world language requirement for students at UW-Madison. Students interested in earning a Bachelor of Arts
degree in the College of Letters & Science will have additional world language course requirements for graduation from UW-Madison and are
encouraged to fulfill those requirement with four years of the same world language within high school.

Reminder on Additional Materials & Continued Interest

Deferred Students – Self-reported mid-year grades are the single most important factor in the admission consideration of a student who has received a defer decision. Those who wish to share updated information since they applied or wish to express continued interest can do so once when self-reporting their grades.

Students on Our Wait List – Applicants offered a spot on our wait list must accept their wait list offer to be considered for admission. It is highly recommended that students on the wait list self-report their mid-year grades if they have not previously. Students on the wait list will have an opportunity to share their continued interest via a form after accepting their spot. Those who accept their spot on the wait list will be notified if they are admitted or if the wait list has closed.

Please do not send or have your students or their families send anything additional, as it will not impact their decision and will not be accepted. If we need any additional information, we will reach out to the student directly.
